Chapter 1

WHAT IS THE ANOINTING?

The anointing is one of the most profound yet misunderstood realities in the life of a believer. Many seek it as though it were a spiritual decoration, a badge of honor, or a personal privilege—but the truth is far deeper. The anointing is the divine empowerment of the Holy Spirit that enables a person to accomplish a purpose that the natural cannot achieve. It is Heaven’s fuel, poured upon human vessels to fulfill God’s eternal assignment.

1.1 Biblical Definition of Anointing

In the Old Testament, the Hebrew word for anointing is “*mashach*”, which literally means to smear, consecrate, or set apart for divine service. Kings, priests, and prophets were anointed with oil, and the oil symbolized the presence, favor, and

power of God resting upon them for a specific task.

- ❖ **Kings** were anointed to govern with wisdom and justice.
- ❖ **Priests** were anointed to minister to God and intercede for the people.

In the New Testament, the Greek word “*chrisma*” is used. It refers to the anointing that brings supernatural ability to fulfill God's work on earth. Acts 10:38 declares:

"How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power, who went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil..."

Notice this principle: Jesus was anointed not for Himself, but for the assignment He was given by the Father. The anointing is purpose-driven, not self-driven.

1.2 Anointing Transforms Ordinary Desires

The anointing does something supernatural—it transforms your desires. It replaces natural cravings with divine cravings.

- Your focus shifts from self-centered goals to kingdom-centered goals.
- Your ambitions are aligned with God's eternal purpose.
- Your ordinary plans are replaced with extraordinary divine plans.

Chapter 2

THE ANOINTING FOLLOWS PURPOSE, NOT PRAYER

Many people operate under a mistaken assumption: they believe that the more they pray, fast, or study the Word, the more likely they are to be anointed. While these spiritual disciplines are important for personal growth and preparation, they do not produce the anointing.

The anointing is not a reward for effort or performance—it is a divine empowerment released according to God's eternal purpose. God's choice and purpose precede human activity.

2.1 God Chooses Before Works

Romans 9:11 declares:

"...that the purpose of God according to

election might stand, not of works but of Him who calls."

Before David tended sheep, before Moses fled Egypt, before Jeremiah was even born, God had already purposed them for specific assignments. Their anointing followed the divine plan, not their human achievements.

The principle is clear: Anointing follows purpose, not prayer or works. Prayer and fasting position you spiritually, but the anointing comes to those already chosen for a purpose.

2.2 Scripture Examples

- **David:** Chosen as king while still a shepherd, unnoticed and overlooked by men. The anointing did not follow his performance; it followed God's plan.

Each example demonstrates that the anointing is God's choice, not human merit.

2.3 Purpose Precedes Power

Chapter 3:

**GOD DOES NOT ANOINT
POSITIONS,**

He Anoints People

One of the most common misunderstandings in ministry and life is the belief that positions, titles, or offices carry anointing. Many assume that being appointed to a role automatically comes with power, authority, or supernatural effectiveness. But the truth is this: God does not anoint positions—He anoints people.

Anointing flows through the vessel, not the seat. It is a divine empowerment for a person to accomplish God's purpose, regardless of their position. Without the anointed person, a position is empty; with anointed people, even ordinary roles become extraordinary.

3.1 Anointing Follows the Person, Not the Office

In Scripture, we see clear examples of God anointing individuals, not positions:

- **David:** Anointed as king while still a shepherd. At the time, he held no formal office, no title, no royal position. Yet the anointing rested on him because God had chosen him.
- **Jeremiah:** God appointed him as a prophet before he was born. His anointing was personal; it was not tied to a title or position within society.
- **Paul:** Called to be an apostle while still persecuting the church. The anointing followed God's choice of him, not the position he held.

The lesson is clear: anointing flows to the individual who carries God's purpose, not to the office they occupy.

3.2 Why Positions Cannot Hold Anointing

A position is simply a place of responsibility. It is a reminder of a task, not a source of power. Without an anointed person, a position is powerless:

- A pastor without anointing may have a church building but no impact.

Chapter 12

The anointing is preserved by character, and the two pillars of character that sustain the anointing are:

1. **Obedience**
2. **Humility**

The Holy Spirit will empower anyone for God's purpose, but He will continue to work only through those whose character aligns with heaven's values. Talent attracts a crowd, but character attracts God.

Without obedience and humility, the anointing becomes short-lived, mismanaged, or misused.

12.1 Obedience: The Pathway of Divine Trust

Obedience is the ultimate proof of surrender.

Chapter 14

THE ANOINTING IN EVERY SPHERE OF LIFE

The anointing is not limited to pulpits, altars, or church ministries.

It is the supernatural empowerment of God for assignment, and assignments are not confined to religious spaces. God anoints people for influence in every sphere where His kingdom must be expressed.

The anointing makes you effective wherever He sends you—whether it is a nation, a boardroom, a school, a family, a government office, or a business environment.

Wherever God has given you purpose, He releases anointing.

14.1 The Anointing Is Not Religious—It Is Governmental

Chapter 15

THE ANOINTING AND LEGACY

Legacy is not what you leave for people; it is what you leave in people. The anointing was never given to end with you. Every God-given assignment is designed to outlive the vessel that carried it. Purpose is generational, and so the anointing that empowers purpose must also be generational.

When God anoints a man or woman, He is not simply empowering them for personal success—He is imprinting His intentions on the earth through a human vessel. The anointing marks you as a carrier of divine influence, and influence is the seed of legacy.

Legacy is the continuation of God's purpose through the life of a person long after they have left the stage of human activity.

1. The Anointing Makes You a Custodian of God's Purposes

Throughout this book, we have discovered that the anointing is not random. It follows design. It follows calling. It follows purpose.

It does not come because a person prays long or reads the Bible much, even though those disciplines are vital for consecration and intimacy with God. The anointing comes because God has chosen a vessel to

accomplish something in the earth, and He empowers that vessel to function beyond human limitation.

To live a life empowered by the anointing is to live with purpose, clarity, responsibility, and obedience.

1. LIVE WITH PURPOSE — THE FOUNDATION OF ANOINTING

You are not anointed to fill space.
You are not anointed to impress people.
You are not anointed to feel spiritual.

You are anointed for function.
